Membership Commitment and Fees for July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025

Membership Commitments are made annually to support the mission, vision and sacred work of Congregation B'nai Jehoshua Beth Elohim. The chart below indicates Membership Commitment and Fees for the 2025 fiscal year.

To qualify for an Associate membership, you must be members in good standing at another congregation concurrently and/or reside out-of-state. Associate Members are not eligible for JLC, and High Holy Days tickets are not included.

Security Fee \$500

The safety of those who work, learn, meet and pray at BJBE, whether in person or online, is of the highest priority and remains a serious commitment with the leadership of our congregation; as such every BJBE member pays this fee. With increased threats to Jewish institutions, this fee includes costs associated with security audits, safety education, enhanced building security features, security guards and costs associated with cyber security.

Building Maintenance Fund

New members who have not yet fulfilled this obligation must undertake a minimum commitment of \$3,200 to the BJBE Building Maintenance Fund. This commitment is payable at the rate of \$400 per year for 8 years. Members under 35 years of age with no children of school age may have their Building Maintenance Fund commitment deferred upon request until they either have children of school age or the older spouse reaches the age of 35. BJBE will waive the Building Maintenance Fund dollar-for-dollar for members who have paid a building fund to another synagogue.
